Quadrix | An eastern reading of the western flooring history



The square; arguably the simplest geometry named by humanity in history and, slightly more complex, the rectangle. These two shapes, and their interplay, form the foundation of Quadrix. The Quadrix series comprises three families: Panels, Q^∞ , and QX. Each of these families, in its own way, narrates the game of these shapes and their governing rules.

In the Panels family (including Q50, Q60, Q80, and Q100), a handful of squares and rectangles are combined to create simple tiles, which are then arranged to complete the flooring design. This design is precise, methodical, and entirely static, echoing historical examples of wooden flooring from the Classical and Baroque eras. Even the name of this design, Versailles, is inspired by its execution in the Palace of Versailles in France.

In the Q^∞ family, the squares and rectangles break free from the constraints of tiles, floating seamlessly across the entire floor. Here, the two basic shapes themselves become tiles. Infinity is freeform and, thanks to its small-scale elements, easily adapts to any point within a space.

In the QX family, the rules governing the arrangement of shapes remain consistent, but the shapes themselves are transformed. In other words, while staying faithful to the layout of the historical Versailles patterns, the Morfloor design team has liberated the basic forms from their rigid definitions. In QX, the edges of the squares and rectangles are slightly curved, and their angles deviate from perfect right angles. Such designs can be found in the domes and arches of Eastern architecture, requiring the expertise and ingenuity of master craftsmen of their time. The QX family reinterprets historical Versailles flooring designs through a contemporary parametric lens, aligning them with modern architectural trends.

In the Quadrix series, Morfloor has simultaneously showcased its loyalty to Western parquet traditions and its Eastern roots. While these three families narrate a comprehensive story of the authentic Versailles floorings, they are not merely historical, they are historically informed. In other words, Quadrix takes the simple motif of parquet, a grid-like arrangement of squares and rectangles and lets it traverse through time and space.

Ultimately, the Quadrix series is less about defining a product and more about offering a morphological perspective on flooring. This approach reflects the philosophy of a brand whose name derives from the fusion of Morph and Floor; Morfloor.

A Legacy of Craft and Heritage

Pre-17th Century (Origins of Parquetry):

Parquetry originated as a decorative flooring technique in Europe, combining small wooden pieces to create geometric patterns. Early parquetry was used in affluent households, particularly in Italy and France.

1684 (Birth of Parquet de Versailles):

Commissioned during Louis XIV's reign, Parquet de Versailles was installed in the Palace of Versailles. It replaced marble flooring, which was prone to water damage, especially from cleaning. The design featured hand-crafted wooden panels in geometric patterns, typically made from oak, walnut, or other fine woods. The panels were arranged in a square layout, often with diagonal lines and intersecting grids, symbolizing elegance and opulence.

17th to 18th Century (Adoption Across Europe):

Parquet de Versailles became a status symbol among the French nobility and quickly spread across European courts. Palaces, mansions, and estates adopted the style, blending it with local architectural preferences.

19th Century (Industrialization and Decline):

The industrial revolution introduced machine-cut wooden flooring, making simpler parquet styles more affordable. However, the labor-intensive nature of traditional Parquet de Versailles meant it became less common outside of high-end restorations or elite constructions.

20th Century (Revival and Restoration):

By the mid-20th century, there was a resurgence in interest in traditional craftsmanship. Parquet de Versailles was reintroduced in heritage restorations and luxury interiors, particularly during the vintage and classical revival movements of the 1980s.

21st Century (Timeless Icon of Luxury):

Today, Parquet de Versailles is celebrated as a hallmark of French design. While modern methods have simplified its production, artisans and heritage craftsmen still create hand-made panels for bespoke projects, ensuring the legacy of its intricate craftsmanship endures

The Dome of Sheikh Lotfollah; A Masterpiece of Islamic Geometry and Artistic Expression

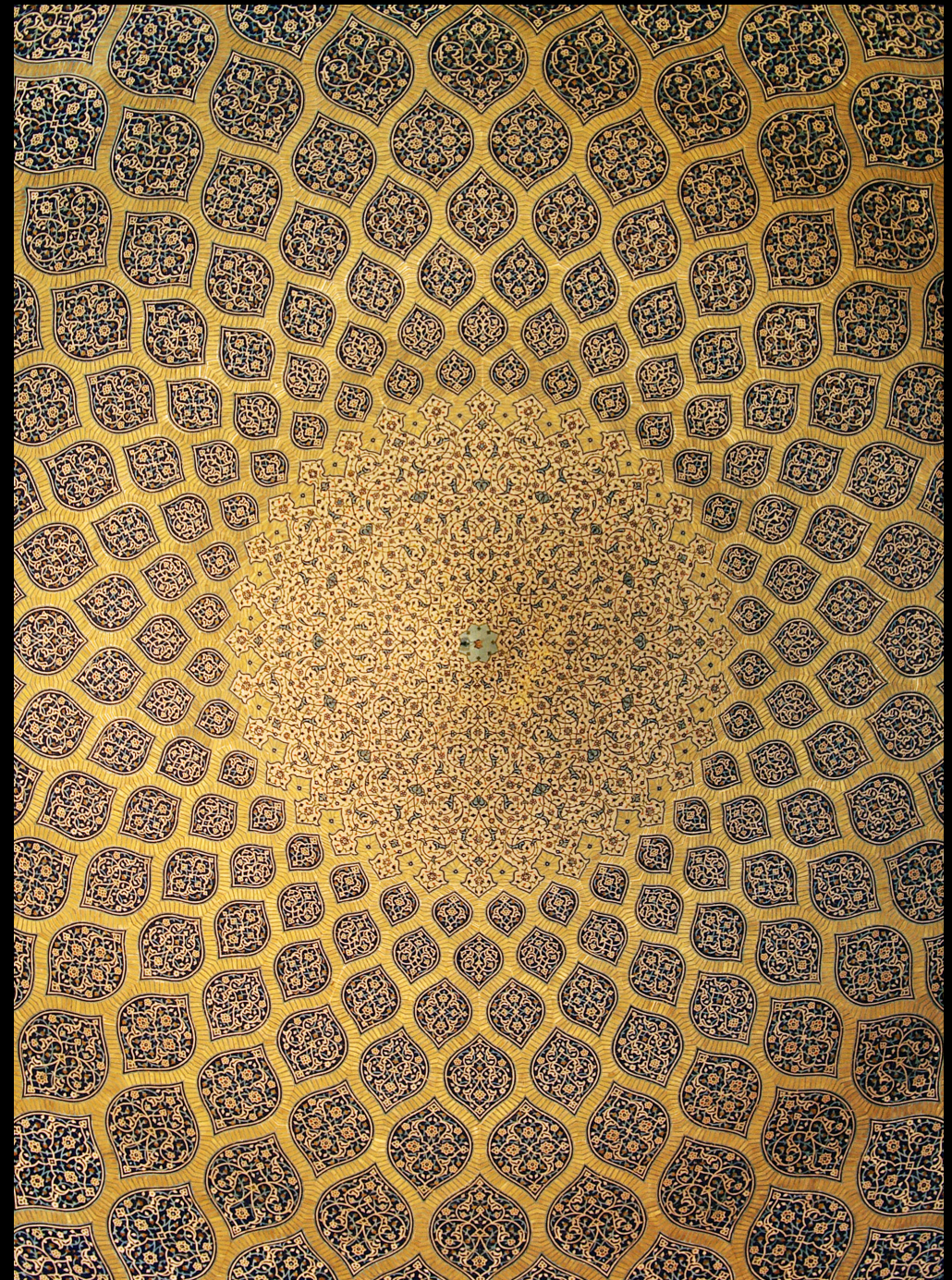

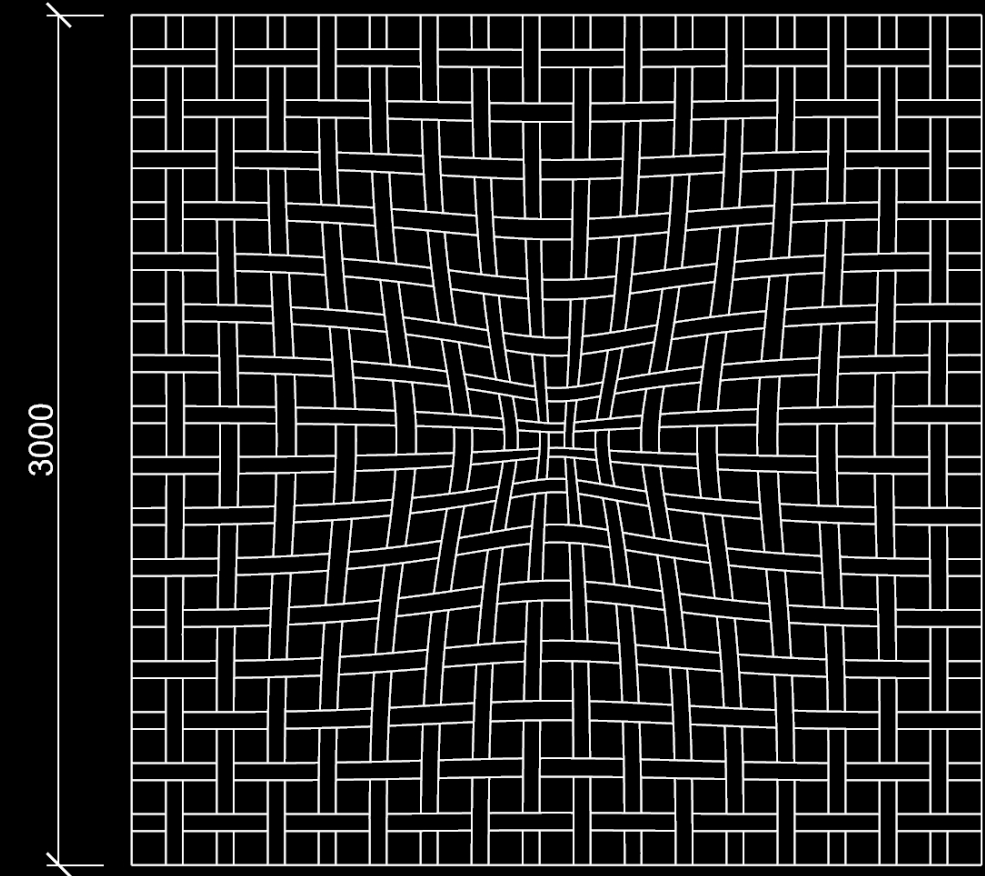


QX2

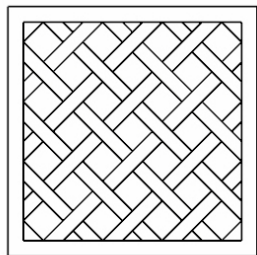
In Versailles parquet, the arrangement of panels is typically centered in the main halls to emphasize the geometric design and intricate details. This layout is traditionally framed with longitudinal parquet along the edges, creating a visually balanced interior. Additionally, the panels can be aligned parallel to the walls or arranged diagonally. Diagonal layouts are often used in square-shaped spaces or areas requiring more visual dynamism, adding vibrancy and movement to the interior while breaking monotony.



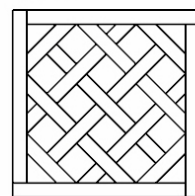

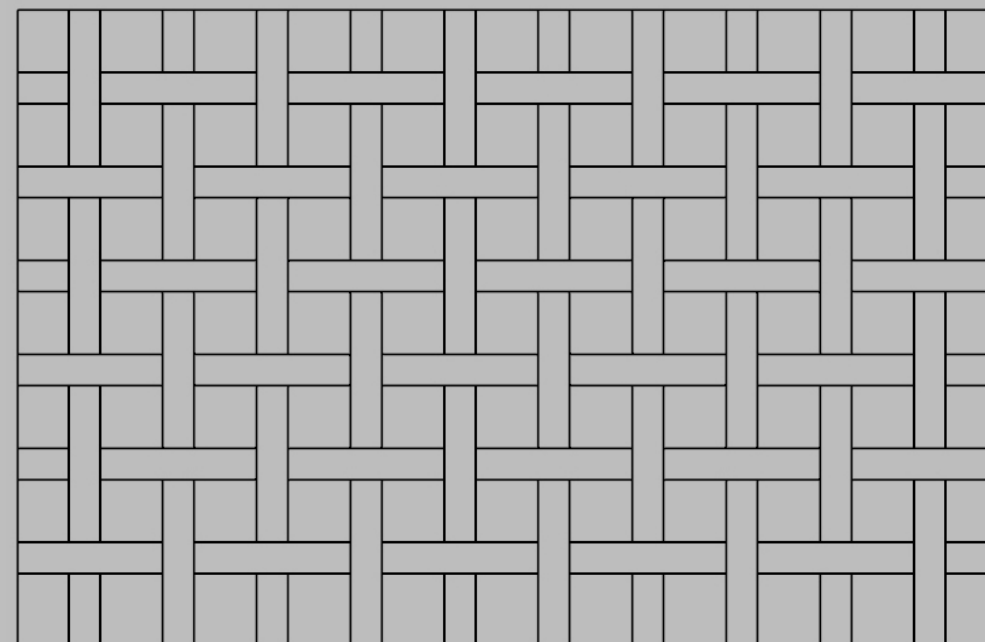
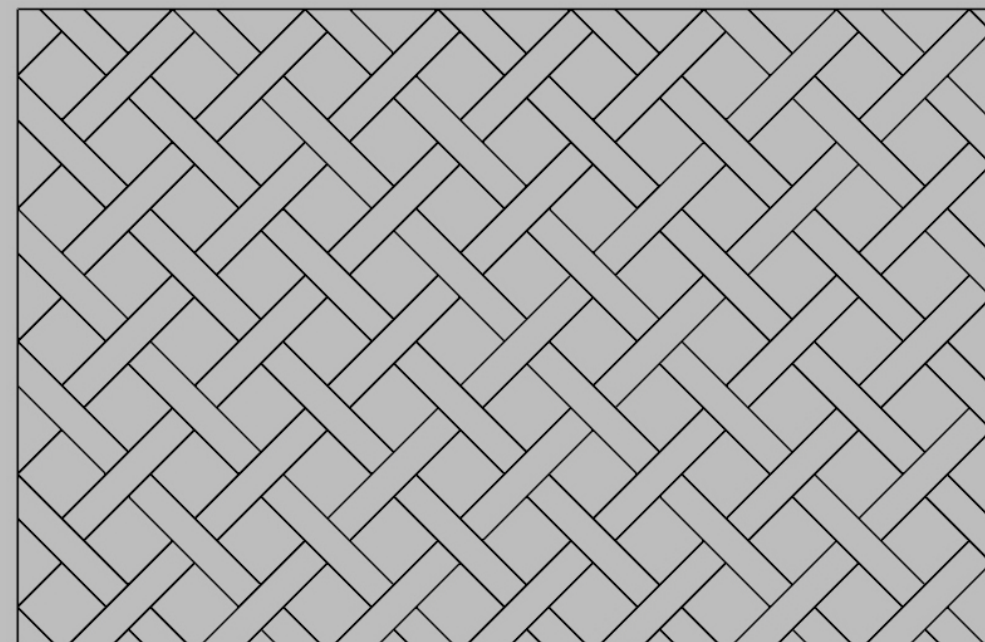




The Q ∞ arrangement seamlessly transforms interior spaces into floating, unified environments. Unlike static geometric designs, Q ∞ allows squares and rectangles to be placed freely across the floor without defined boundaries. This feature ensures a cohesive and uninterrupted appearance, eliminating any sense of separation or segmentation.

Q ∞ can be installed either parallel to the walls or in a diagonal layout. In the parallel configuration, the design lines align harmoniously with the walls, creating an orderly and structured atmosphere. On the other hand, the diagonal arrangement adds visual movement and charm, especially in square-shaped spaces where enhanced depth is desired. This flexibility in layout enables designers to tailor the flooring to the unique requirements of each project.

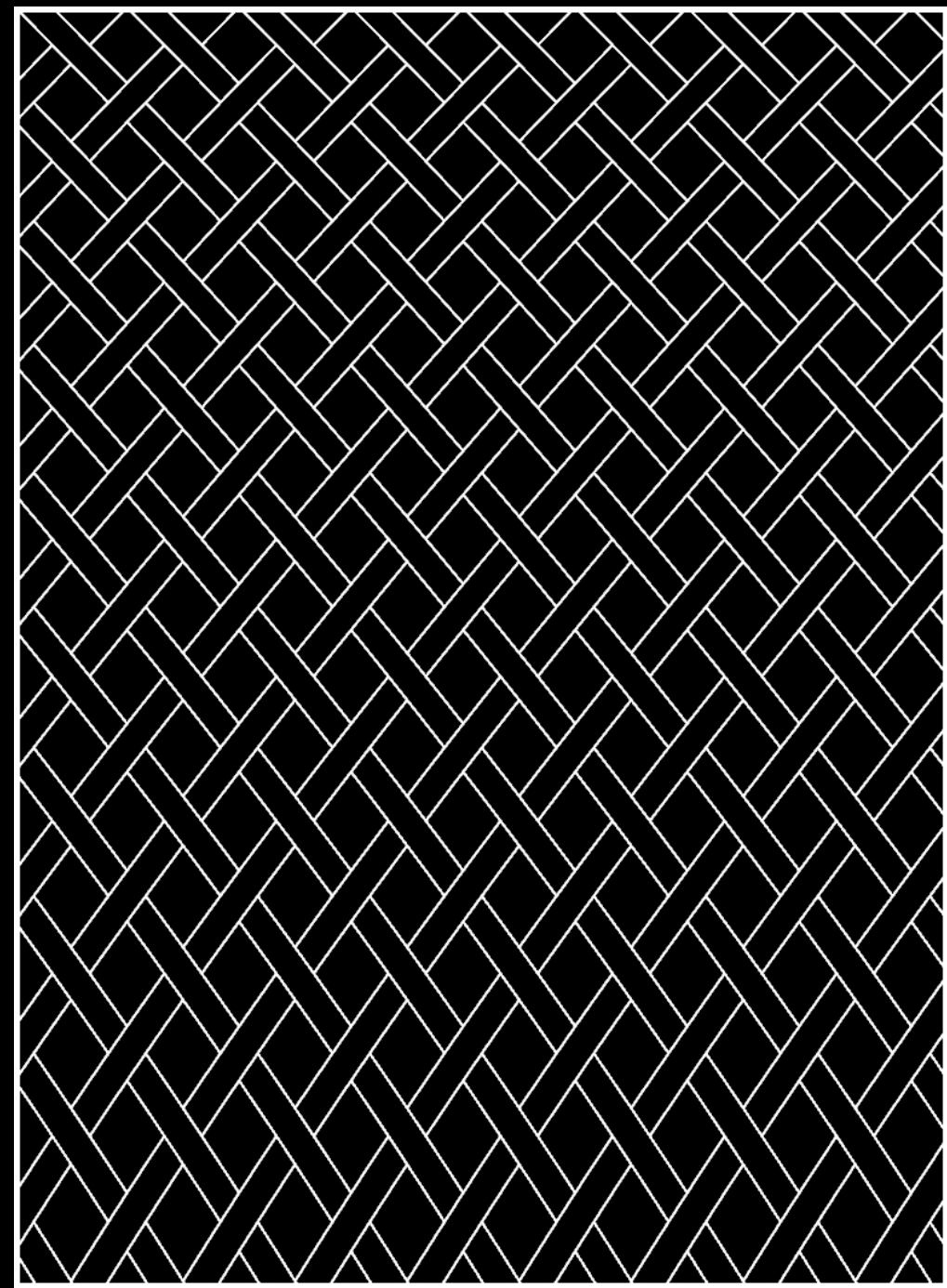
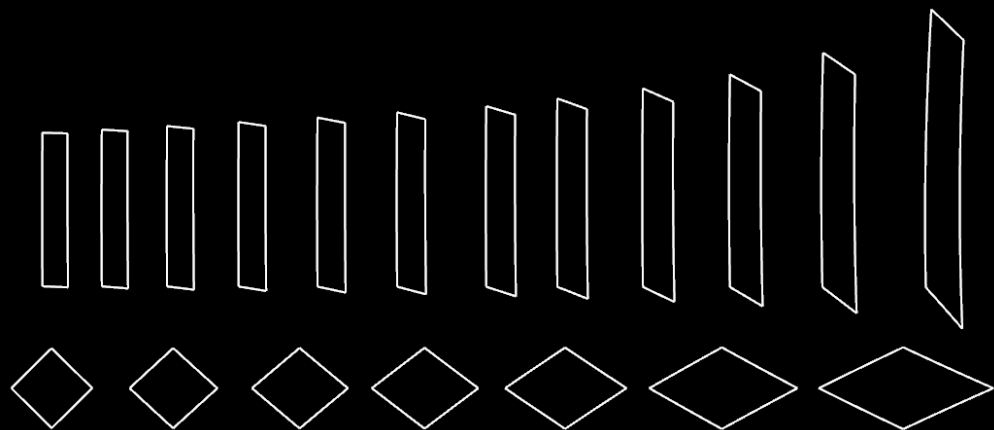

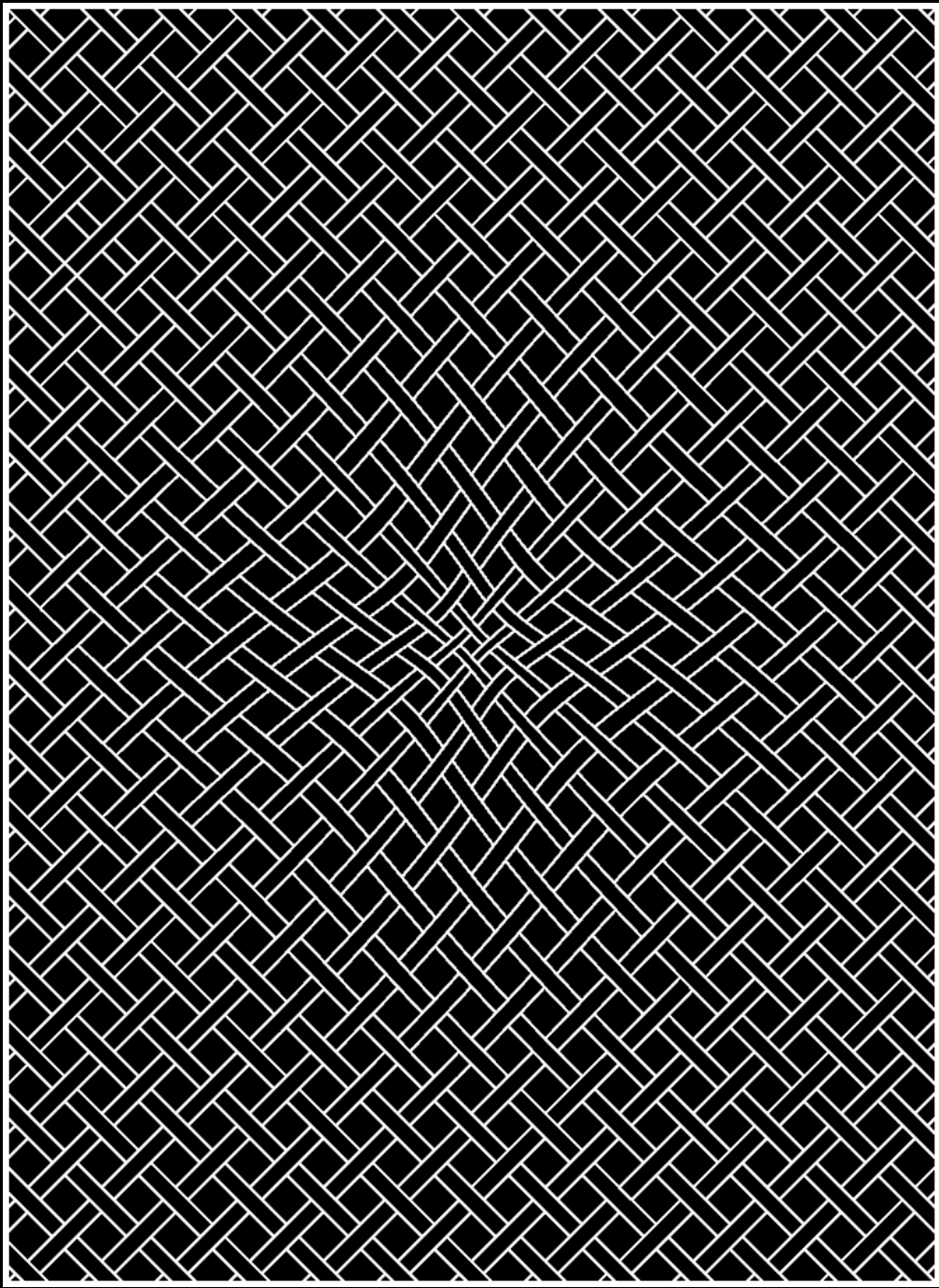
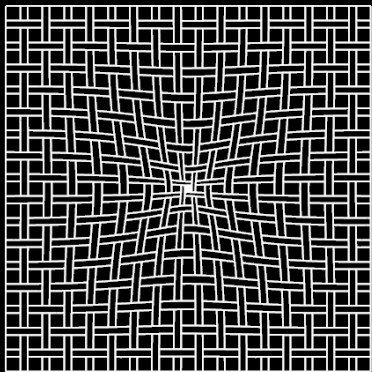
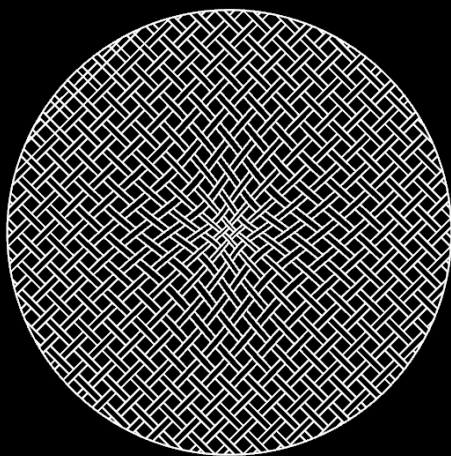
QX1 emerges from a parametric form with a length of 5 meters, resulting in a periodic pattern of 10 meters. This ensures that users will not perceive any repetitive tiling, even when only part of it is used in a space. Moreover, in extremely large layouts, its periodic repetition is unlikely to alter its morphological essence.

Each QX1 tile contributes uniquely yet consistently to the overall design, lending identity to the interior space. The design employs gradual transitions and curves, contrasting with the precise and rigid geometry found in conventional layouts. The tiles feature curved angles and non-linear edges, infusing the space with a sense of motion and dynamism. These characteristics add a layer of sophistication and intricacy to each tile, ultimately enhancing the overall design.



The QX2 and QX3 modules are designed with outer edges that seamlessly integrate with Q[∞] tiles. This key feature allows them to dynamically and vibrantly fill central spaces while transitioning to a calmer and more cohesive aesthetic at the perimeters and borders. As a result, these modules, despite their diversity and dynamic nature, effortlessly align with the classic and orderly design of Versailles parquet.

This harmonious compatibility ensures that the modules can be effectively used in a variety of spaces without disrupting the overall design unity. Their adaptability bridges the gap between dynamic central elements and the timeless elegance of peripheral layouts.

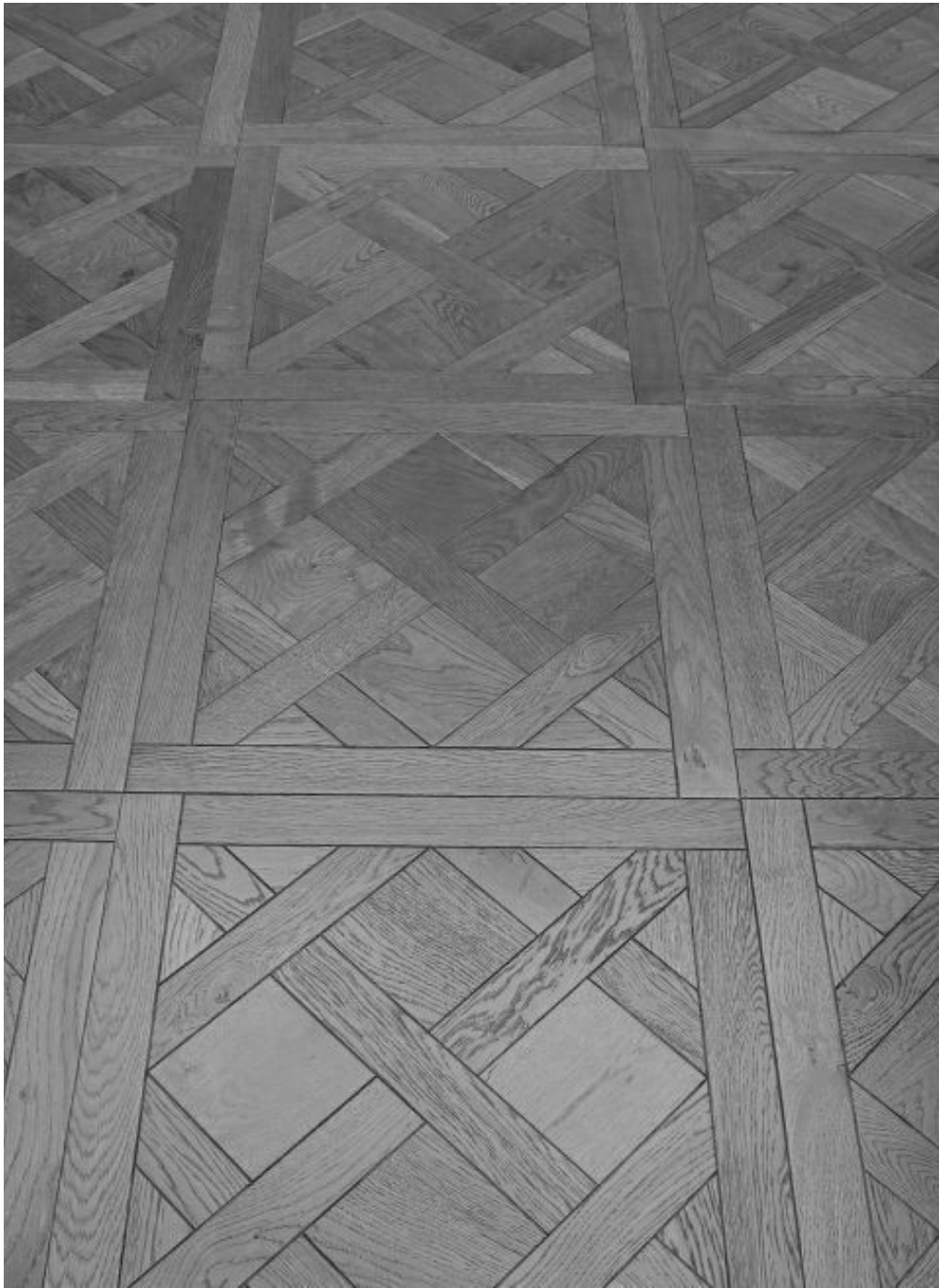
